

Kaiser Kuo is an editor-at-large at SupChina.com and co-founder of the Sinica Podcast, the most popular English-language podcast on current affairs in China.

Until April 2016, he served as director of international communications for Baidu, China's leading search engine. In 2016, Kaiser returned to the U.S. after a 20-year stint in Beijing, where his career spanned the gamut from music to journalism to technology.

Kaiser also spent a year in Beijing from 1988 to 1989, when he co-founded the seminal Chinese heavy metal band Tang Dynasty. He then served as editor-in-chief at ChinaNow.com, one of China's first bilingual online magazines. He was China bureau chief for technology and business magazine Red Herring, and worked as Director of Digital Strategy for Ogilvy & Mather in Beijing. For four consecutive years, Kaiser was been included on the Holmes Report's "Influence 100," its annual list of the 100 top in-house communications professionals in the world.

In May 2016, he was honored by the Asia Society with a leadership award for "revolutionizing the way people live, consume, socially interact, and civically engage." He speaks frequently on topics related to politics, international relations, and technology in China. Kaiser has served for many years as an Official Writer for the World Economic Forum in Davos, Switzerland. He lives in Chapel Hill, North Carolina, with his wife and two children.
